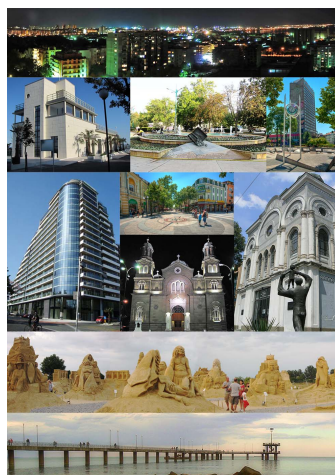

Burgas has always had a profound relationship with the sea. The area has been inhabited since ancient Thracian times, with nearby settlements and trade routes connecting the Black Sea to the Balkans and beyond for centuries.

Over time, Burgas evolved from small fishing and trading communities into one of Bulgaria's most important coastal cities — today a major economic centre, an international transport hub, home to one of Bulgaria's busiest airports, and one of the country's most modern and organised cities.

Why Burgas Feels Surprisingly Safe

Burgas is widely considered one of the calmer and safer cities in Bulgaria, particularly compared to many larger European urban centres. Bulgaria generally maintains relatively low levels of violent crime compared to many Western countries, and Burgas benefits enormously from lower density, a calmer

pace of life, strong family culture, and less urban aggression than many larger European cities.

Many foreign residents and visitors consistently describe Burgas as peaceful, manageable, walkable, and comfortable for everyday living — especially for retirees, families, remote workers, and people simply tired of chaos.
